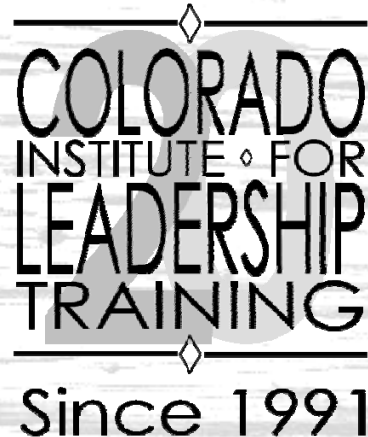

ABOUT JOHN SALAZAR: A sixth-generation farmer and rancher, Commissioner Salazar served three terms representing Colorado's 3rd Congressional District, and was a member of the House Agriculture Committee. Before his time in Congress, Salazar served on the Colorado Agricultural Leadership Forum, and was also on the Colorado Agricultural Commission from 1999 to 2002 before being elected to the Colorado House of Representatives from 2003 until 2004.

Commissioner Salazar's advocacy in Congress earned him recognition for outstanding service by the American Farm Bureau, and he earned the Golden Triangle Award from the National Farmers Union in 2005. He played a key role in passing the historic farm bill of 2008, and authored the rural broadband and specialty crop provisions. With a seat on the powerful House Appropriations Committee in his third term, Salazar worked on national energy issues, jobs creation and the economy.

Governor John Hickenlooper appointed John Salazar as Commissioner of Agriculture this January, and now he spends his days helping market Colorado through its varied agricultural products. He is happy to be home, and honored to join us and accept this honor July 7th.
